Dear Fellow Scandinavian Organizations,

Scandinavian Seminar is excited to present a new study abroad opportunity – Crossing Borders Global Studies held at Krogerup Folk School in Denmark.

The aim of the Crossing Borders Global Studies course is to enable young, engaged people from around the world to make a positive difference in their lives and the world around them. The course is designed to help students understand the global issues affecting their lives: monetary drivers, the media, global warming and sustainable growth, war and peace. As part of the course, students will participate in a 10-day study tour to Paris and Rome to visit UNESCO and the World Food Program.

The Global Studies course is offered in two semesters, which can be taken separately or concurrently. The spring course runs from January 11 - June 13, 2009 and cost \$6800.00 including the application fee. The fall course runs from August 23 - December 19, 2009 and costs \$5800 including the application fee. Airfare is not included in the price.

The course was designed by Garba Diallo, Director of Crossing Borders, an international NGO that was founded in Denmark in 1999 to provide space and skills training for youth, educators, and media professionals from areas of conflict.

A semester or year at a Scandinavian folk school is an affordable, international experience. It will enhance a student's formal education in an exciting, multi-cultural setting. Students attending folk Schools will focus on their own interests, abilities, and personal growth while learning about subjects that motivate them. The folk school experience is meant to challenge the whole person.

Scandinavian Seminar has been sending students to Scandinavia for the past 60 years and has had over 10,000 students of all ages participate in our programs. We provide guidance in choosing the right folk school for the student, completing the application and acceptance process, acquiring the residence permit, and making travel arrangements. In addition, we maintain contact and provide support throughout the student's stay in Scandinavia.

We have attached a course outline and syllabus for the Global Studies course, and a pdf of the program brochure and poster for your review. FINNAIR INCREASES NORTH ATLANTIC SERVICE Six flights per week starting October 26

NEW YORK (October 20, 2008) - Effective October 26, 2008, the start of its winter season, Finnair will offer six flights per week between New York and Helsinki. For the national carrier of Finland, this is an increase from five flights per week during last winter season.

According to Christina Colliander, Director of Sales North America, Finnair, "Sophisticated international travelers like to use the Great Circle Route to travel to their final destination via Helsinki, especially to destinations in Scandinavia, Russia and the Baltics – but also to India and Asia. It is markedly quicker to many parts of the world. And of course, Finnair's inflight product has all the amenities one needs to arrive rested and ready to do business!"

Flights this winter, scheduled every day of the week except on Wednesdays, will depart New York (JFK) at 5:45 p.m., to arrive in Helsinki at 8:50 a.m. the next morning, while flights from Helsinki depart at 2:20 p.m. and arrive at JFK at 3:55 p.m. on the same day.

On Finnair's intercontinental flights, Business Class offers modern lie-flat seats and a complimentary full beverage service, while in Economy Class beer, wine and sparkling wine are free of charge. Recently, minor changes have been made in the maximum weight allowance per checked bag. USA passengers are now allowed two (2) checked pieces of luggage free of charge, and each bag may weigh up to 50 lbs.

Finnair offers a quick minimum connection time of just 45 minutes at Helsinki-Vantaa Airport, and because of the airport's lay-out, transfers are quick and easy. Finnair's route network includes more than 50 international destinations, and 700 more through its cooperation with **one**world alliance partners.
